VINEYARDS

Our approach to winegrowing is rooted in the earth and refined by hand. Great wines are grown, not made so we farm organically, harvest by hand, ferment with native yeast, avoid filtering or fining and use minimal sulfur. Ocean breezes, rocky soils, mountainous terrain establish the Santa Cruz and Gabilan Mountains as exceptional winegrowing terroir. Each vineyard we work with has a unique personality that inspires us to let them speak for themselves. Our steep windswept hillsides first planted over 100 years ago are now planted to Pinot Noir, Syrah, Grenache, and Roussanne. Founder and winemaker Bradley Brown has evolved the style at Big Basin to produce wines with more energy, intensity and dimension that speak clearly of their mountain origins.



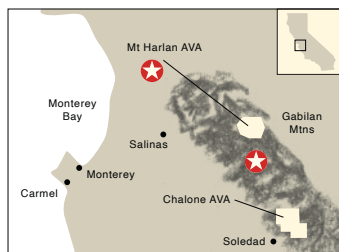
2019 DUNE AND MOUNTAIN PINOT NOIR

VINEYARDS

The two vineyards that make up this cuvée, Coastview Vineyard and Lester Family Vineyard, are each exceptional vineyards from which we produce vineyard designate wines. Coastview is the highest elevation vineyard at 2200 feet on a mountain top overlooking the Salinas Valley. The decomposed granite with limestone veins produce beautiful high toned floral notes. Lester Family is planted in sandy soils that are often blanketed in fog that rolls in off of Monterey Bay. The combination of these two vineyards make for elegant aromatics and vibrant fruit on the palate.

WINEMAKER NOTES

2019 was a good year in California. A later than usual Spring led to a moderate growing season with some warm spells pushing ripening along towards harvest. Well lignified stems allowed us to use 100% whole clusters. We find that the use of whole clusters amplifies aromatic complexity and adds a layer of texture. The resulting final wine has exceeded our expectations. The vibrant, spicy red fruit, beautiful silky texture and mouthfeel with a finish that is long and sustained. The aromatics jump out of the glass and the wine that follows is equally expressive and compelling. This wine is enjoyable now, though it will benefit from cellaring for several years.
